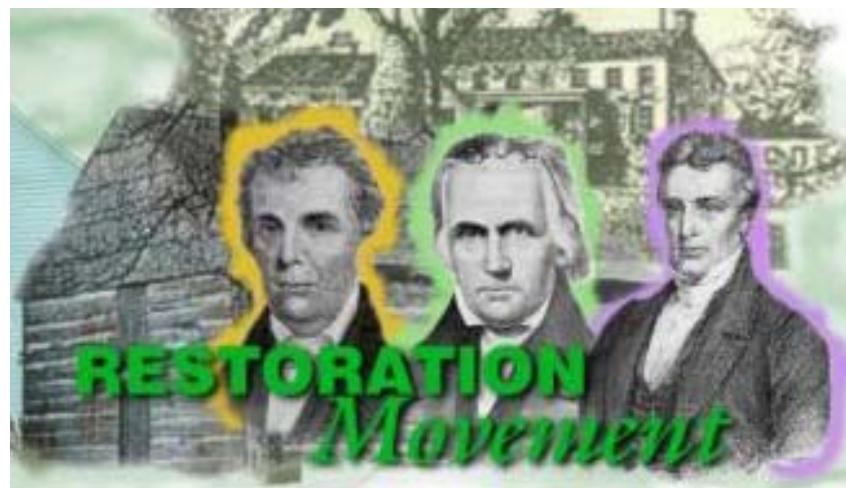


Restoration Heritage Tour —Cincinnati—

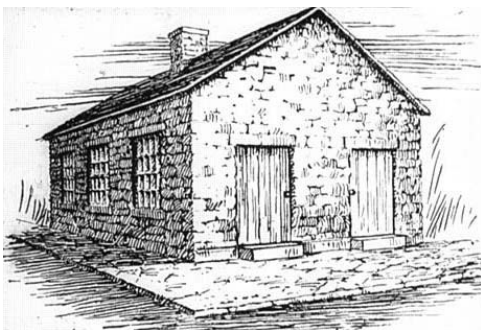

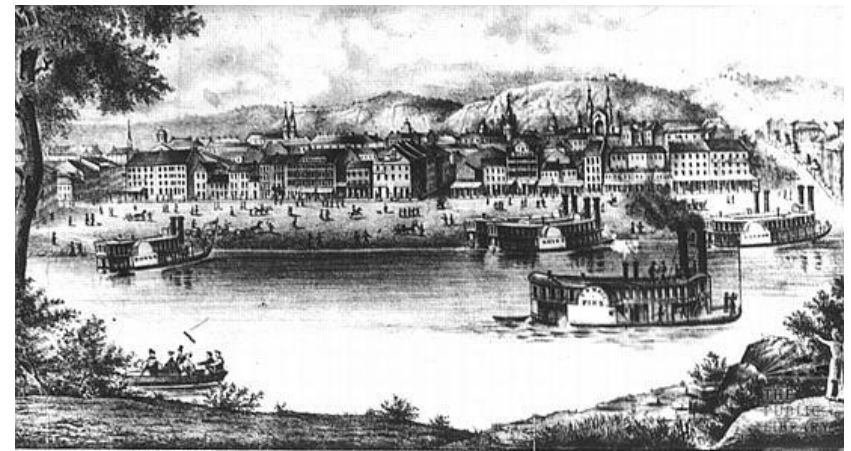
- Springdale, OH – Site of Springfield Presbytery.

- Cincinnati, OH (Sharon Woods Village) – Log House of Presbyterian Minister James Kemper, the first to call for heresy trials against the “revivalists” of the 1801 Cane Ridge Revival.

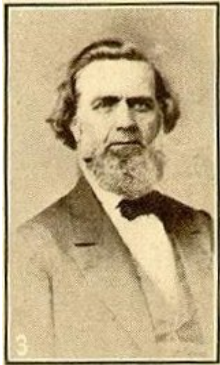

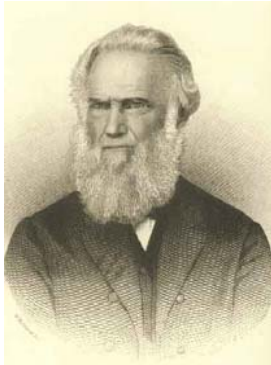

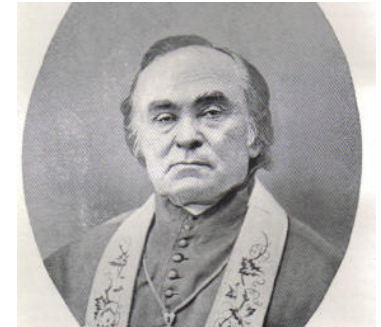
1:15 **TRANSITION** – Additional Area Sites of Interest to the Restoration Movement:

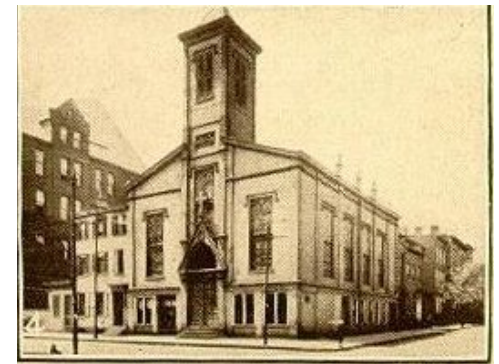
9:15 **TRANSITION** – Cincinnati's Role in the Restoration Movement.

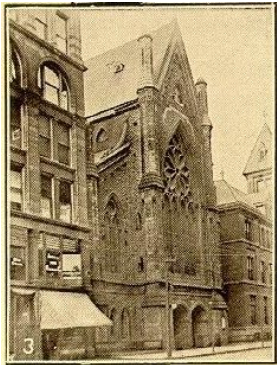

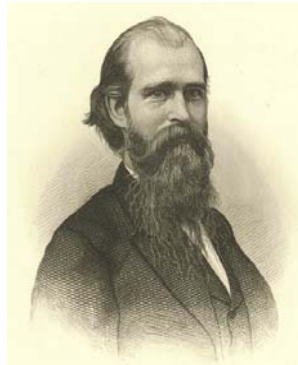
9:45 **TRANSITION** – James A. Garfield & the Restoration Movement (Notice the Garfield statue as the bus travels through Garfield Plaza).

10:30 **FOURTH STOP** – *Richmond and Cutter Streets*

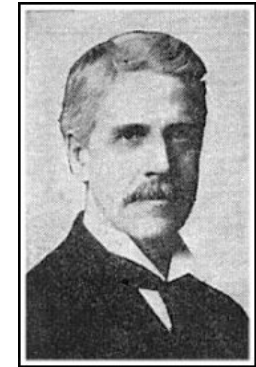
- **Richmond Street Christian Church** – Site where the ideas originated for the Christian Woman's Board of Missions and the Foreign Christian Missionary Society.

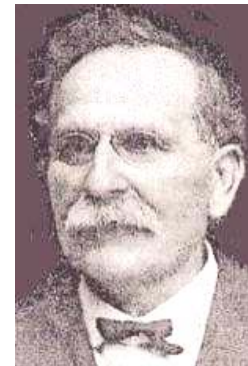

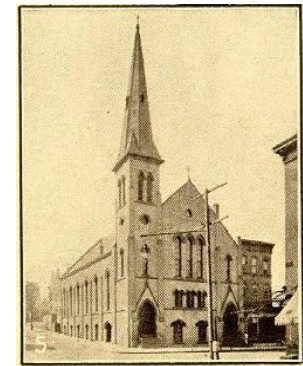
